View all latest The Confederation of African Football (CAF) has set 11 November as the deadline for countries to declare interest in staging the 2025 Africa Cup of Nations. A new host must be found after Guinea was stripped of right sbecause of concerns over infrastructure and facilities. The continent’s governing body expects finalised bids, including documents, proposed host cities and government guarantees, to reach its Cairo headquarters by 16 December. CAF inspection teams will tour bidding countries from 5 to 25 January next year in its quest to find a suitable replacement for Guinea. Findings from the inspections will be submitted to the 24-member CAF executive committee, which will announce the successful country or co-hosts to stage the 2025 finals on 10 February. A top CAF official told BBC Sport Africa that the body wants to avoid the embarrassment of awarding the event to countries who are “unable to raise good infrastructure and hospitality to show to the rest of the world”. Cameroon was the venue for the 2021 Nations Cup earlier this year while Ivory Coast is set to host the 2023 finals, which will be played in early 2024. Some countries have already shown interest in bidding for the 35th edition of the continent’s showpiece, but they are yet to make official declarations. Morocco, which hosted this year’s Women’s Africa Cup of Nations finals in July, intends to apply to host the 2025 men’s finals, a source within the Royal Moroccan Football Federation indicated. Nigeria’s early interest to step in and co-host with Benin has gone quiet since Amaju Pinnick’s exit as president of the country’s football body (NFF). Bids from Algeria, South Africa and Senegal have only been speculative, although public interest is overwhelmingly in favour of the latter staging the competition. P. p. c. +/- 1 Angola 14 6 4 2 0 7 2 +5 2 Soudan 8 6 2 2 4 6 -2 3 Niger 7 6 2 1 3 7 6 +1 4 Ghana 3 6 0 3 3 7 -4 Scheduled 35th edition of AFCON 2025 Africa Cup of Nations2025 **المباراة الحاسمة** 17th Final 2025Coupe d'Afrique des Nations 2025Official logoTournament detailsHost countryMoroccoDates21 December 2025 – 18 January 2026Teams24Venues9 (in 6 host cities) – 2023 2027 – International football competition The 2025 Africa Cup of Nations, also referred to as AFCON 2025 or CAN 2025, is scheduled to be the 35th edition of the biennial African football tournament organised by the Confederation of African Football (CAF).[1] It will be hosted by Morocco for the second time and the first since 1988.[2] Morocco was originally scheduled to host the 2015 edition, but withdrew due to fears stemming from the Western African Ebola virus epidemic.[3] Due to FIFA expanding its Club World Cup competition to 32 teams and having it scheduled for June and July that year, this edition of the tournament will be played between 21 December 2025 and 18 January 2026.[4] The situation has been further complicated by the addition of two extra match days scheduled for the last two weeks of January in the expanded Champions League that begins this season in Europe.[5] This edition of the tournament was scheduled to be the second after 2019 to take place during the northern hemisphere's summer (June–July), in order to reduce scheduling conflicts with European club teams and competitions;[6] the previous 2023 edition was moved to January and February 2024 owing to the adverse summer weather conditions in Ivory Coast.[7] Guinea was originally set as hosts for this edition of the tournament, but had its hosting rights stripped after affirming its inadequacy of hosting preparations.[8][9] After a second bidding process,[10] Morocco was named as the new hosts on 27 September 2023.[11] Ivory Coast are the defending champions.[12] CAF stripped Cameroon from hosting the 2019 edition of the tournament on 30 November 2018 due lack of speed of progress in preparations.[13] but accepted former CAF president Ahmad Ahmad's request to stage the next edition in 2021. Consequently, the original hosts of 2021, Ivory Coast, became hosts of the 2023 edition with Guinea instead hosting the 2025 edition, which until then had no hosts.[14] The CAF President confirmed the timetable shift after a meeting with Ivorian president Alassane Ouattara in Abidjan, Ivory Coast on 30 January 2019.[15] On 30 September 2022, current CAF president Patrice Motsepe announced that Guinea had been stripped as host for the 2025 edition due to inadequacy and speed of progress in hosting preparations.[8] Consequently, a new process was re-opened for a replacement host bidder.[10][16] On 27 September 2023, the 2025 edition was awarded to Morocco[11] and the 2027 edition to Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania.[17][18] Main article: 2025 Africa Cup of Nations qualification Team qualified Team failed to qualify Team banned or did not enter Not a member of CAF The qualifiers were held between 20 March and 19 November 2024, starting with the preliminary round (20–26 March 2024) and then the group stage (2 September–19 November 2024).[19] The preliminary round draw was held on 20 February 2024, 14:00 CAT (UTC+2) at the CAF headquarters in Cairo, Egypt.[20] The eight involved national teams were seeded into two pots of four based on the FIFA World Rankings from 15 February 2024, [21] Seychelles and Eritrea were excluded from the qualifiers. The eight teams were split into four ties which were played in home-and-away two-legged format.[20] The four winners: Chad, Eswatini, Liberia and South Sudan advanced to the group stage to join the 44 teams which entered directly.[22] The group stage draw took place on 4 July 2024, 14:30 CAT (UTC+2) in Johannesburg, South Africa. The 48 national teams involved were divided into twelve groups of four each, which consisted of the 44 teams that entered directly, in addition to the four winners of the preliminary round, and were seeded into four pots of twelve each based on the June 2024 FIFA World Rankings.[23][24] The following teams qualified for this edition, all of them have previously participated in the tournament.[25] Morocco, the host country, played in the qualifiers in Group B despite qualifying automatically. Ghana, four-time African champions, failed to qualify after finishing bottom of the Group F, missing out on the Africa Cup of Nations for the first time since 2004.[26] [27] Tunisia qualified for the 22nd time and extended their record for consecutive participations, reaching the tournament for the 17th time in a row, having not been absent since 1994.[28] Comoros, Gabon, Sudan and Zimbabwe made their return to the continental tournament after missing out on 2023.[29] Benin and Uganda made their return after an almost five-year absence from the event. Botswana qualified for the second time after their first participation in 2012.[30] Cape Verde, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Mauritania and Namibia also failed to qualify after appearing in 2023. CAF announced the tournament schedule on 31 January 2025, which did not include kick-off times for matches.[33][34] The top two teams of each group, along with the best four third-placed teams, will advance to the round of 16.
