It became one of the country's best-loved anthems of peace and free love. The song addresses people who are traveling too much about what happens once you arrive at your destination. On the other end of the spectrum, "Four Strong Winds" is a more melancholy song about travel. This scenic motorbike loop takes three to five days to complete and will take you along spectacular landscapes. The Ha Giang Loop is known for its gorgeous rice terraces, lush mountains and traditional villages. It's renowned as one of Southeast Asia's most beautiful places in Vietnam, and it was one of my favourite experiences in this country. There are some things to know before heading to Ha Giang and doing the loop, however, and that's exactly what this post is all about. You will find everything you need to know if you're planning on doing the Ha Giang Loop in this guide, from the cost, where to stay and other logistics to itinerary options and insider tips. You can find an overview of the seasons below: Spring (March to May): This is a great time to do the Ha Giang Loop! Temperatures will probably be clear, which makes it ideal. Summer (June to September): Although it's possible to do the Ha Giang Loop during this season, summers tend to be pretty rainy in northern Vietnam, so this is not the best time to visit Ha Giang. If you have more time on your Vietnam itinerary, you could stay on the loop for longer too. I did the Ha Giang Loop in four days, which I thought was perfect. Quan Ba Highlights: Bac Sum Pass - Quan Ba Heaven Gate and Twin Mountain - Lung Tam - Na Khe Pine Forest The first day of this Ha Giang Loop itinerary will take you to Yên Minh, a town home to the Yen Minh pine forest. After about an hour of driving, you will ride up the Bac Sum Pass, a twisting mountain pass that offers spectacular views of the surrounding mountain scenery. You will have an even more beautiful view of the surroundings. Make sure not to miss the Twin Mountains, these are two symmetrical mountains right next to each other that resemble breasts and are also called the Fairy's Bosom. If you're a cultural traveller, you will love the next stop - Lung Tam. This village is home to the Hmong people, and you can learn more about the town of Yen Minh. This forest is known for its towering pine trees and lush greenery. Highlights: Pho Bang - House of Pao - Hmong King Palace - Lung Cu (optional) After taking some rest in Yenh Minh, it's time to make your way to Dong Van. One of the most popular places to visit on the way is the House of Pao in Lung Cam. This house is owned by a family with the same name, and it became famous after the movie Story of Pao was shot here. Although this is a beautiful place and I do think it's worth visiting, this is also the most touristy place I visited on the Ha Giang Loop. If you want to visit a less touristy village in the area, you can go to Pho Bang before heading to Lung Cam. This is a small detour, but it's a charming place. The next stop is the Hmong King Palace (also known as Dinh Vua Mèo), a must-visit during the Ha Giang Loop. This palace is nestled in the sa Phin Valley, and as its name suggests, this is where the king lived and from where he ruled. The palace was built in the early 20th century and quickly became one of the region's most important architectural landmarks. [] Optional: If you don't mind making a detour, you can also visit Lung Cu - the most northern point of Vietnam, located just a few kilometres from the Chinese border. Ma Pi Leng Pass Nho Que River - God Cliff - Meo Vac The way from Dong Van to Du Gia is a pretty exciting one as there are some interesting things to do in this area. After about an hour of driving, you will reach the 20 km (12 mi) long Ma Pi Leng Pass, which is renowned for its stunning beauty. This pass was carved out by ethnic minorities who worked under the government in the 1960s. There are some great photo ops along the way, and this is also where you will catch your first glimpse of the Nho Que River. Once you reach the top of the Ma Pi Leng Pass, you can hike is 2 to 5 km long, depending on where you park your bike. Denver wrote and recorded "Leaving on a Jet Plane" in 1966. He made several copies and gave them out as Christmas presents, as the lyrics are about the pain of leaving a loved one. Aged just 23, Denver apparently wrote the song while waiting at Washington Airport during a layover. Michael David Rosenburg, known by his stage name Passenger, is an English singer-songwriter and musician. The lyrics are about seeing an Australian man that has been traveling alone in Scandinavian, lamenting on the fect that he is a long way from family and loved ones. 'Catch and Release" is a song from American singer-songwriter Matt Simons that became a hit across many countries in Europe. The lyrics are about wanting to disappear to somewhere else, away from daily life. The song was remixed by Dutch house DJ duo Deepend and had better chart success across Europe. Kygo is a Norwegian DJ and producer. He has worked on huge singles like "I See Fire", "Higher Love" and "It Ain't Me". "This Town" is about wanting to escape your hometown, where all your friends are settling down, and going off to explore the world instead. "What We Live For" is a track from American Authors' 2016 album of the same name. The song is upbeat and feel-good, about escaping on a road trip with someone and enjoying the journey. The album debuted at No 60 on the Billboard 200. The music video shows clips of people having fun at the pool, attending concerts and skateboarding down an open road, capturing the beauty and fun of traveling and seeing the world. "On Top Of The World" from Imagine Dragons is an upbeat song that captures the thrill and excitement of traveling. The lyrics are about seeing life as one long car journey to 'hell'. "Beyond the Sea' was popularized by Bobby Darin in 1959, an English-language version of 'La Mer' by Charles Trenet.
