Overview The University of South Florida is a large public university with an enrollment of more than 42,000 students. More than 11,000 of those students take graduate and doctoral classes from the university. U.S. News & World Report ranks USF as one of the best colleges in the United States and one of the nation's best public schools. USF appeared on the similar lists issued by Washington Monthly, Forbes and ARWU. It offers an advanced standing MSW that students with more experience can complete online. Strengths A unique aspect of this MSW program is that it features classes that meet at night. The university expects students to log in and attend class from 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm, though some classes may end earlier. They usually take one class that meets on Tuesdays during the first semester. This increases to two classes per week later in the program. Students will attend classes on both Tuesday and Thursday nights. They will also do placements that help them gain some field experience. The university requires that full-time students work 20 hours a week in the field, but it only requires that part-time students do 10 hours of work a week. Concentrations USF offers an MSW program designed to go over all the top areas and fields in social work. It does not offer concentrations for students because it expects them to develop strong skills and learn more about all important topics as they work on their degrees. Students can learn more about a specific field like working with substance abusers, domestic violence victims or children through their placements. As they do multiple internships, students can gain experience working in two or more fields. Program Requirements This program features 20 credits of required social work classes. Students will then pick at least two electives to take. They also take two field instruction courses that allow them to complete the 900 hours of fieldwork that they must do to graduate. Full-time students can finish the program in just three semesters of classes, while part-time students spend five semesters working on their degrees. Some classes run for more than two hours once or twice a week. Other classes give students more freedom and let them complete their course requirements throughout the week. Admissions Requirements As USF only offers an advanced standing online MSW, it requires that incoming students have some social work experience. Students must have a 3.0 undergrad grade point average in any of the social work classes they took, but they must also have a 3.0 GPA in all courses taken over the last two years or 60 credits. USF has an online application that students can use when applying. They'll use a credit or debit card to pay the \$30 application fee. The university also requires that students submit three reference forms. It will not accept any family references. USF asks for at least one professional reference and one academic reference. Students can have a professor, coworker, peer or employer fill out the last form. The university has different deadlines in place and requires that students submit all required information prior to one of these deadlines. Students must submit two 500-word essays. The first allows students to describe why they want to work in the social work field and what inspired them to study the subject. They will use the second essay to address a specific social problem and their solutions to that problem. Faculty USF has a low ratio of just 24 students to each professor working both online and on its Florida campus. It employs more than 1,700 full-time and part-time instructors. Some of those professors received endowments and funding that allowed them to conduct their own research. The instructors working in the online MSW experience have a strong understanding of local issues, including the effects of drug abuse on individuals and their families. They can also help students understand the complex issues that they see in both rural and urban settings. Online Courses Though students can take different types of electives, they must take some required classes too. Social Work Practice with Couples and Families is a class that goes over how to work with small groups, while Evaluations of Clinical Practice in Diverse Settings is a course that looks at how students can evaluate the practices where they work. Social Work Practice with Individuals is a class that more closely focuses on working with individuals in a private setting. The only class that students take that is only worth two credits is called Health, Illness & Disability. This program also features a Capstone Project. Worth only one credit, this class allows students to create a final paper based on what they learned in the program. Internships USF requires that students do their internships at the same time that they take classes online. Full-time students start their internships during their second semesters in the program. Part-time students will wait until the third semester before beginning their internships. The university requires that students meet with a placement director and go over some of their interests and career goals. This helps the director find a placement that is suitable for that student. USF can help students secure placements in seven different counties in Florida. Online students may have the option of doing placements outside of Florida. Those students must still talk with the director and go over their interests and skills. Students can find placements on their own and submit those agencies to the university.
