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Andy Beynon joins us on Friday to serve up an intimate tasting menu at The Chef's Table.Andy is chef proprietor of Michelin-starred Behind restaurant in London Fields. Opened in 2020, the intimate 18-cover chef's table is designed as a fully open-plan space, eliminating the divide between kitchen and dining room. The 10-course blind tasting menu celebrates the sea, focusing entirely on day-boat fish and shellfish, sourced predominantly from British shores. With sustainability at its core, every part of the fish is utilised throughout the menu, while other ingredients are chosen at their seasonal peak.Andy's twenties were spent working in the country's top kitchens where he gained experience in classical fine dining which he combined with his love of seafood. His experience included Michel Wignall's Michelin-starred The Latymer\*, Phillip Howard's The Square\*\* and Claude Bosi's Hibiscus\*\*, before some time at Fenchurch\*\* with Daniel Fletcher. He was part of the development kitchen at Jason Atherton's Social Company until he was ready to open his first solo venture; Behind\*, an eighteen-cover chef's counter restaurant in Hackney. Serving modern, seasonal food with an Italian accent, Murano is one of the few restaurants to hold 4 AA rosettes.Between 2013-2019, she opened three critically acclaimed Cafe Murano's throughout London, the brassier little sisters to Murano.Chef judge on BBC1's Britain's Best Home Cook in 2020, current co-host of the podcast, The Dish by Waitrose & Partners, and with three cookbooks to her name: Cucina, Angela's Kitchen and best-seller The Weekend Cook.
