We came from the north to reach Walla Walla, and most of the time we were almost alone on the road. The hill itself was very easy to climb and offered an incredible view from the top, as far as the eye could see. If you continue to Walla Walla, you will be rewarded with great wine. The park is located in the middle of the "palouse" region, which is known for its rolling hills. The huge cone-shaped rock in the park was a stunning sight from the start. We drove up and around until we reached the top, where we found interpretive signs and a restroom. The views were truly awesome, but it was very windy that day, so be sure to dress accordingly. The road leading to the top had many potholes, which made us think it wouldn't be fixed until spring 2025. However, we brought a jacket because it was very windy and chilly at the top. The rocks at Step toe Butte are 400 million years old, and you can drive all the way to the top. It's an excellent hike if you try, especially if you're coming from Spokane or Portland. We stopped on our way to Portland and were glad we did. The view from the top is absolutely gorgeous and far-reaching. It's definitely a place worth visiting, and everyone says it's the number one destination in the Palouse for good reason. The park offers a 360-degree view of the Palouse, making it an ideal spot for photography at any time of day. However, please note that the road is very windy and cold, especially up top. You'll need to pay \$10 for a visitor pass for one day or get the year-round pass for \$30. You can purchase the year pass at the supermarket in Colfax. We visited Step toe Butte State Park again in 2018 and had an excellent time. The views were still beautiful, and it's definitely worth a detour. Be sure to go all the way to the top for the best views. You'll know you're there when there are no more ascending lanes and there's a vault toilet. There is also a small picnic area at the base of the butte with tables set among apple trees, along with a clean vault toilet that has hand sanitizer. The park is open until May 2022, according to their website, but may be closed after that for several months due to road repairs and improvements. Be sure to check the official website or call the number on the webpage for updates.
