And if you want a lilly pilly in your garden, it's easy: just find a local bush that has fruit you like the taste of. The outer flesh of the fruit prevents germination, so eat it. Then plant the seeds in some seed-raising mix. Wait and watch them grow! We found them to strike very easily and grow vigorously. Once they become larger, divide them into individual pots. They are quite drought tolerant in the soil, and grow in full sun or semi-shade. But in a saucepan they keep them looking lush by watering regularly. A couple of parasites and diseases affect lilly pills. The first, and probably the most obvious, is psillaids or pimple rooster. This causes a new deformed growth and small clumps to form in the leaves. The second problem is the scale and this can be cleaned with white oil. But generally if you keep the plants strong, healthy and well-nourished, they are less likely to be affected by these problems. The Lilly pillies are australian native trees and shrubs, with smooth and shiny leaves and a habit of dense and bushy growth. They are resistant and will happily grow in the sun or shadow and wet and well drained soil.
