The abandoned West Allis Burger King building at 106th Street and Greenfield Avenue has finally been demolished, according to Mayor Dan Devine's post on X. The property was declared a "public nuisance" by the city in October 2023, and after several months of negotiations, Burger King agreed to tear down the building. The decision comes after the city sent a written notice to Burger King in May saying the property was overgrown with weeds, had broken glass and painted wood that was rotting underneath. Despite Mayor Devine's public plea for help in October, Burger King did not respond promptly, leading the city to take legal action. A few days later, on October 9, the city filed a lawsuit against Burger King, asking the court to declare the property a "public nuisance." The lawsuit stated that Burger King had taken action but failed to meet the city's desired level of repair. The building was ultimately demolished, and Mayor Devine announced plans for planting and curbs in the spring. It is unclear what will be built on the lot, but the mayor expressed relief at the removal of the eyesore.
