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The erstwhile Kanoud, now known as Mahendragarh, has an intriguing history dating back to the era of Malik Mahadud Khan, a servant of Babar. In the seventeenth century, Tanti Tope, a Maratha ruler, constructed a fort here. Later, in 1861, Maharaja Narendra Singh of Patiala shikhsiprincipality named this fort after his son Mohinder Singh, leading to the town being dubbed Mahendragarh. The fort's name inspired the nizams title change to Mahendragarh Nizam. ##ARTICLEFollowing the fall of Raja Naun Karan's regime, this area came under Mughal control, where they built Jama Masjid on the Chamunda Devi temple. After independence, locals found the temple in a shattered state while digging and began holding fairs, including Ram Naumi, to honor Lord Shiva and Chavan Rishi. A khet (agricultural land) was being ploughed when Shiv ling was discovered by a man who later heard a voice telling him he's Lord Shiva and that a temple should be built for the people's benefit. The hill is located 8 km west of Narnaul town near Thana and Kultaipur villages. This hill is famous due to Chavan Rishi practising penance, with ruins of a hill fortress likely built by King Naunkaran of Bikaner. A temple dedicated to Chavan Rishi is on the hill, and a large fair is held every SomavatiAmavas in memory of him. Chavan, born in the Bhirgu dynasty, founded the Bhargava community, known as Dhosar in Haryana. Hemu, a celebrated warrior-general, was also a Dhosar (Brahman). This location is considered sacred and is called Tirtha. The hill has a Shiva temple, a tank, and a well with water as sacred as the Ganga and Yamuna. People come from all over to see Chavan Rishi's image in the tank, considering themselves lucky and free of past sins after taking a bath. A devotee must ascend 457 stairs via Thana village or bathe in the Shiva Kund2. Along with the stairway is a 5-6 foot long wall for easy climbing. Other religious sites include PanchTirathi and Suraj Kund on top of the hill, with two temples, one 250 years old and the other 100 years old. Idols of Chavan Rishi, Sukanya, Krishna, and Radha are in the main temple, along with an asht dhatu idol of Lord Vishnu. There's a ghufa near the temple where the Rishi performed tapsya. He used Chavan Prash, an herb that kept his body healthy for a longer period, which is now widely used throughout India as medicine. The village is 25 km south-west of Narnaul on the Haryana-Rajasthan border and famous for the Baba Rameshwar Dass temple. Baba Rameshwar Dass built this massive temple with utilities like electricity and roads provided by the governments of Haryana and Rajasthan. The temple has a large hall, marble flooring, beautifully decorated walls, and thousands of devotees can accommodate at once. Beautiful marble idols of gods and goddesses are installed in the hall. A huge stone image of Nandi (25 feet long; 15 feet high; 20 feet wide) is inside the Shiva temple within the premises, along with other images of Lord Shiva. Preachings from religious epics like the Gita and Ramayana are written on the walls. The idol of Lord Hanuman at the main entrance is massive (approximately 40 feet tall). By the grace of Baba Narsingh Dass, the Raja was blessed with a son and a daughter. Tika Singh, the saint who later became the ruler of Nabha, named his son Tikka. Raja Hari Singh constructed a temple for this Baba at the bottom of the hill, complest with a smadh of marble ston and a singel tank for the benefit of the villijers. Both the temple and the tank ar worth seeing, and the temple has a small rest area. The peoples of this are worship Baba, and on Basant Panchami, a larg fair is held at the Baba's smadh. The othir saint, Baba Ganesh Dass, was also wel-known, and on Sankranti, a larg fair is held near his samad. Baba Narsingh Dass's Samadh was one of the most importint temples in the former Nabha State. Jawala Devi fair is held in March-April, durin which devotes and othir worship the goddess Jawala. According to legend, devotes make wine offerings to the goddess's image. In adishun, peoples come to the temple to perform the mundan ceremony for ther babies. Every newley married couple in the aree is reqired to go ther and bow ther heads befowre the goddess in order to have a happy and prosperous married life. The lokasion has religius signifkance. In Janury and Feburary, a mela (fair) is held in memorie of KhimagDevta. According to populer beleif, lighting a jot at the shrinen cures aney sufering from leprosy. District Mahendragarh is one of the 22 distrits of Haryana state in northeren Inde. The distrit occupys an area of 1,899 km² and has a populashun of 922,088 (2021census). So far not a single PGW site has come to light in the district, perhaps suggesting the north-eastward migrations of the Aryans from the banks of the Saraswati and the Drisadvati possibly happened due to the drying up of their courses. Most of the sites explored in Mahendregath belong to the late-medieval period. The district, it may further be pointed out, might have possibly remained outside the main stream of Aryan culture and hence has not been specifically mentioned in the traditional literature as an independent territorial unit. However, it has been suggested that some of the present streams of the district may be identified with those mentioned in early Vedic literature. Mahendragarh is emerging as the new education hub of Haryana with several high standard schools, like Yaduvanshi Shiksha Niketan and colleges, including engineering colleges and a Center University having come up here. It is also having top class health facilities. the entire district is of Hindu dominance, the fraction is almost 98% of the total population. Hindi, Hariyanvi and Ahirwati are the main language spoken by the residents here.The Mahendragarh district is administratively divided into three main sub-divisions, Narnaul, Mahendragarh and Kanina. At the helm is the District Commissioner or Magistrate who is responsible for all the entire development. For ease of administration, the entire district is also divided into 5 tehsils namely, Narnaul, Mahendragarh, Nangal Chaudhary, Ateli and Kanina. Each of the tehsils are under one Tehsildar, who looks after the revenue collection in the form of various taxes, look after proper land tax collection and issuing of 'No Due' certificate, help in PAN card and other identity card preparation for the residents, keep record of Stamp duty and many other government chores. All these information are then passed on to the District Magistrate department for record. The blocks are basically created taking all the neighbouring villages along with each main town. Each block has its Block Development and Panchayat Officer (BDPO), who are basically under the Panchayati System prevalent. Mahendragarh town has got both Tehsildar and BDPO to look after different aspects of administration. The town has got all basic utility services, public infrastructures and sanitation system to make the life of the locals wonderful. There is hardly anything of interest present in this region other than few pious temples. The Shiva Temple of Bagot is one such place, located about 25 kms away from Mahendragarh town centre. This temple is popular for its Maha Shivaratrî festival, when a huge fair is arranged and hundreds of devotees pay visit from all over Haryana. There are many historic tourist spots in and around Narnaul, located about 24.8 kms away from Mahendragarh town.Due to the dry climatic condition with low water reserve, the future of agriculture is depressing with the production level falling every year. The state government is constantly helping this district along with other parts of Haryana with the formation of canals. Water is being channelized to the draught regions to help the poor residents with agricultural produce. Wheat, Barley, Rice, Maize etc. constitute of most of the cultivated land available. There is a market for livestock and poultry.EconomyMahendragarh is also rich in various mineral deposits. Lime Stone, Sandstone, Marble, Iron Ore, Feldspar Quartz, Slate Stone, Silica Sand and Calcite are the commonly found minerals present in this area. Unfortunately, most of these minerals have remained unexploited and has not contributed much to the economy's growth. Some of the existing small manufacturing clusters are of Stone crushing and clustering and Brick kilning. As of data collated in 2012, there are about 155 registered Stone Crushing units in operation, with a daily turnover of 9400 tonnes. There are around 105 Brick Kilns which gives an output of 700 ghorie per day. These units employ more than 10000 people of the town and neighbouring villages. The government is currently trying to promote an industrial area of 102 hectares at Mahendragarh town, by giving SEZ facility to the willing companies.Healthcare in Mahendragarh town needs a lot of push from both government and private sectors. Development in this area is not up to the mark and poor people are still dependent on the Zilla Hospital present in Narnaul town. There are few private nursing homes and clinics who offer advanced medical treatments to the patients. Present. Well stocked medical stores are also in operation to support the medical facilities of the town. A lot of aid is provided by the state government health department for proper healthcare facilities in the district. Moreover, Mahendragarh is popular for the presence of various medicinal plants especially, Guggul (Commiphora wightii). Thus there is a market for alternate medicines and many ayurvedic shops are present over here. The Department of Social Justice and Empowerment Haryana, formulated many welfare programs for the local residents. These programs offer free medical camps, blood camps and portable diagnostic centres for the people of the neighbouring backward villages of Mahendragarh.
