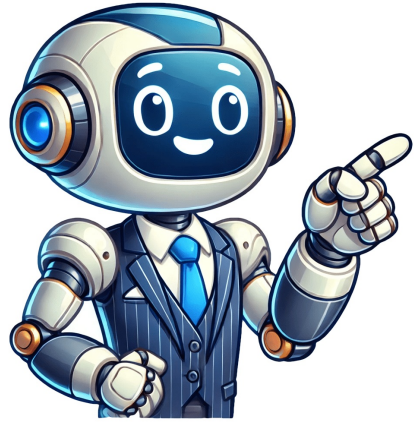


I'm not robot



One thing that's always an issue with me doing equipment reviews is that I just don't have time to look at every single treadmill or elliptical out there, and unlike some of the other review sites, I'd rather not write up a bunch of reviews on stuff I've never seen before. It's unfair to both my readers and the manufacturers themselves. Unfortunately, this means I sometimes miss certain equipment or it takes too long for me to get around to reviewing them in time for my Best Buy Awards. **UPDATE** This review is actually about an older model - click here for more recent info on the Schwinn 430 elliptical. One piece of equipment that I wish I had gotten to review last year, which might have done well enough in my Ichi-Ban Best Buy Awards, is the Schwinn 430 Elliptical. I think it would do great this year, though. As a side note, the unit I'm basing my review on was actually brought in by Hikaru from the DOJO to work on over the past week - he's been doing extra work there and looking for repair jobs every day. To be honest, Hikaru is turning out to be quite handy and has potential as a future Sensei himself. The Schwinn 430 Elliptical is one of Nautilus' budget-friendly options that they started producing about over a year ago. Interestingly enough, when you compare it to its pricier sibling, the Schwinn 418, the 430 comes out on top in many areas for a \$599 elliptical. This little unit packs a lot of value considering its price. It's solidly built, weighing around 150 pounds and featuring a flywheel that tips the scales at about 14 pounds (I had to estimate these weights based on my own workouts). The 430 is surprisingly smooth for an entry-level elliptical, rivaling many units in the \$999 range. With features like 16 resistance levels, 8 programs, comfortable articulating footpads, heart rate monitoring, and control, the Schwinn 430 is a top choice for anyone looking for a high-quality elliptical on a budget. After using it at the DOJO a couple of times this week, I'll say that you really need to keep the rails well-lubricated - ideally every 30 hours or so of use. I also wish Nautilus would have offered a more competitive warranty with the Schwinn 430, though 90 days for labor just isn't enough. Adding an extended warranty option would be a worthwhile consideration for most buyers. For light workouts, the Schwinn 430 is hard to beat, and given its value at \$599, it's definitely worth checking out - the Treadmill Sensei gives it 4 out of 5 golden buddahs. Weighing approximately 150 lbs and capable of handling up to 275 lbs, this machine features a 20" stride length and 22 workout programs, making it a solid choice for those looking to get fit at home. Comfort and Resistance: What to Look for in an Elliptical Machine The Schwinn 430 elliptical machine offers a comfortable stride length range, ideal for taller users. A longer stride length can enhance the overall workout experience, making it feel less like jogging in place. With a stride length of 20 inches, this machine caters to those with a greater height range. You'll need to get off the elliptical machine to adjust the incline setting, then get back on - manual inclines can be pretty annoying to use. My assumption is that you'd set the incline before your workout and keep it consistent throughout. A manual incline system is better than nothing, but only slightly so. Overall, the 430 doesn't boast the heaviest flywheel or anything exceptional, but it's reasonably sized for its price range. I like that it offers many resistance levels too, although the manual incline system might be cumbersome during workouts. The Schwinn 430 features 22 workout programs - one of its strong points is exercise variety. This provides a wide range of preprogrammed workouts to choose from, making it appealing to those seeking a large workout library. Additionally, it has 2 user profiles, allowing you to save info for two separate profiles and easily track your stats. The console boasts dual LCD screens, making it easy to view all your workout stats simultaneously. It also features a USB port for charging your phone or tablet during workouts, an audio jack for listening to music through the built-in speakers, a cooling fan with 3 speed settings, and a water bottle holder. Assembling the 430 should be relatively straightforward for most users - it helps if you're somewhat handy. The process isn't complicated, and Schwinn's assembly manual is easy to follow, with large images that clearly show which piece of hardware attaches to which. Having someone assist you will make the process easier, especially when attaching the stabilizer legs. Most users found the assembly process easy, requiring around an hour. Schwinn backs the 430 Elliptical with a residential warranty consisting of 10 years on the frame, 2 years on parts, and 90 days on labor. While the warranty is shorter compared to high-end machines, it's reasonable for a budget elliptical. When compared to other budget machines, the warranty holds up well. A lifetime frame guarantee would be optimal but unrealistic in this price range. That being said, several users have complained about parts breaking during use and loud noises during operation. Schwinn's customer service doesn't exactly have a great reputation either. The Schwinn 430 Elliptical Machine is a budget-friendly option that offers a good balance of features and price. While it's not the most durable machine, its warranty is better than many in its class. With a longer stride length and plenty of workout programs, this elliptical can be suitable for lighter-intensity workouts. However, users should expect to replace it within a few years. Some models have reported breaking down after several months, which is common in the entry-level segment. The Schwinn 430 Elliptical Machine measures 70.1" x 28.2" x 63.2" and requires a workout area with a perimeter of 5'9" x 2'4". For safety and easy access, it's recommended to have at least 1-2' clearance around the machine. A room with an 8' ceiling height should be sufficient for most users under 6' tall; taller users will require a higher ceiling. The machine features two sets of nonadjustable handlebars: fixed handles with HR sensors and dual-action handles that don't integrate HR sensors but are moveable. Both types of handles have cushioning for comfort and safety. The pedals are large, ribbed, and U-shaped with a protective guard to ensure secure footing. They accommodate different foot sizes and feature articulating precision path foot motion technology to reduce stress on the back, hips, knees, and ankles. The machine has a 20" stride length and is not adjustable, but it can incline up to 20%. It's powered by a belt drive system with a high inertia flywheel, solid cranks, and pulleys. Users can pedal forward and backward to tone more muscle groups. The unit features an eddy current resistance system with 20 adjustable levels that requires a power outlet for operation. The Schwinn 430 Elliptical Trainer offers a unique feature in its magnetic brake system, which doesn't wear out parts and eliminates the need for replacements over time. It also provides adjustable resistance levels through 10 quick keys or gradual Up/Down adjustments from 1-20, catering to various fitness goals such as weight loss, heart health, muscle toning, and overall physical fitness. The machine boasts a manual incline system with 6 positions, equivalent to 0%-10% incline levels. Although this requires users to adjust the position manually rather than on the console, it provides diversification in workouts and challenges for burning calories and toning muscles. When choosing a suitable ceiling height, ensure there's enough clearance considering the unit's floor-to-pedal height of over 20". The console features a dual monitoring system tracking 13 workout stats, with readable displays requiring adequate illumination. Workout metrics can be transferred to USB flash drives or uploaded to SchwinnConnect or MyFitnessPal for storage and progress tracking. The machine comes with 22 workout programs, including custom user-defined profiles and 9 pre-set profiles with various resistance levels and heart rates tailored for beginners and advanced users. The console also features additional keys such as Quick Start, Pause/End, Programs, Goal Track, Fan control, and a tablet holder, along with acoustic speakers, USB charging port, and a 3-speed cooling fan for comfort. A water bottle holder is attached to the mast below the console, ensuring proper hydration during workouts. However, it's noted that devices on the tablet holder may obstruct the view of the upper screen monitor. The Schwinn 430 Elliptical Trainer offers a portable solution for home workouts, featuring transport wheels at the front base for easy relocation. With a minimum storage space requirement of 70.1" x 28.2", it provides sturdy and stable exercise with 22 workout programs, including dual LCD screens for distinct readability and goal tracking. The device boasts 20 levels of computer resistance, 10 quick keys for adjustments on the go, and a 3-speed cooling fan to maintain user comfort throughout the session. Other notable features include a USB charging port, ergonomic static handlebars with heart rate data transmission, two integrated levelers, and an oversized crossbar tubing for stability. The unit supports up to 300 lbs of weight capacity and has a stride length path of 20". To maximize the efficiency of your elliptical trainer, make it a habit to keep it spotless all the time. Avoid exposing the console to any form of liquid or moisture, as well as direct sunlight, which can cause damage. Before each use, give the machine a thorough inspection to confirm that every component is securely fastened and in excellent working condition.
