Before we dive into the plans, I want to emphasize that I believe priority data matters most on Verizon LTE, and I do not believe it matters as much or at all on T-Mobile or AT&T. Why is this? This is because Verizons LTE network, I find, tends to be the most contested. When you have a lot of people all using the cellular network at the same time, having (or not having) priority data can make a larger difference on your cellular networks, meanwhile, I find to have exceptional capacity. Of my decade of testing out and reviewing cell phone plans, I do not feel I have ever noticed being deprioritized on T-Mobile or AT&T. The networks typically have enough capacity to handle the data throughput of all cellular connections at the same time. So, to be candid, I wouldnt worry about priority data if you are going to sign up for a plan on T-Mobile or AT&T.
